Article I. These Guidelines are enacted to encourage students to achieve outstanding performance; qualified scholars can be good examples for other students.

Article II. There are Outstanding Performance Scholarship, Academic Distinction Scholarship, Direct Entry Scholarship and Enrollment Scholarship for Outstanding Students; the grants process is described as follows:

Outstanding Performance Scholarship:

- (1) 4-year College and 2-year College students or 5-year Junior College students whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are 90 points or higher in each semester.
- (2) Grants (prizes) and certificates of award will be awarded to the scholars.

Academic Distinction Scholarship:

- (1) 4-year College and 2-year College students or 5-year Junior College students whose academic overall average scores are 85 points or higher and their conduct scores are 82 points or higher in each semester.

Based on the academic scores, two students with the highest scores will be selected as the scholars in each class, in each semester; however, winners of the Outstanding Performance Scholarship are out of this selection. Scholars from the Dept. of English in the 5-year Junior College should have different minor fields of study. Grants (prizes) and certificates of award will be awarded to the scholars.

### Direct Entry Scholarship:

- (1) The graduates of the 5-year Junior College (including students requiring an extension of study), whose academic overall scores are ranked in the first 50% of the class, with conduct scores higher than 80 points, without having any major demerit, applying to study in the 2-year College of Day Div., 50% of the tuition and incidental fee will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). (However, for the scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.) NTD20,000 will be granted upon enrollment for students who are not the scholars regarding this scholarship.
- (2) The outstanding graduates of the 5-year Junior College (including students requiring an extension of study and elite class students), whose academic performance achieved the following conditions can apply to study in the 2-year College of Day Div., or transfer students who apply to study at the Dept. of Applied Chinese, Dept. of Foreign Language Instruction, Dept. of Translation & Interpreting, Dept. of International Affairs, Dept. of International Business Administration, Dept. of Digital Content Application and Management and Dept. of Communication Arts in the 4-year College of Day Div. The grant that equals the tuition and incidental fees will be awarded during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study).

Students whose academic overall scores are ranked in the first 20% of the class and their conduct overall scores are higher than 80 points without having any major demerit.

Students, whose results of CSEPT achieved at least 280 points (or accomplished the same results of other corresponding language proficiency tests) and whose second foreign language proficiency reached the level of students who major in a second foreign language.

20-30 scholars will be selected annually; if the applicants are more than this number, based on the scores, scholars will be determined by the Recruitment Committee of the 4-year College and 5-year Junior College.

The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.

- (3) The graduates of the 4-year College and 2-year College (including Day Div. and Div. of Continuing Education) and the 5-year Junior College whose academic overall scores are ranked in the first 50% of the class and their conduct scores are higher than 80 points without having any major demerit, 50% of the tuition and incidental fees for studying in the graduate institutes will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded. NTD10,000 will be granted upon enrollment for students who are not winners of this scholarship. From the second semester, for students whose academic overall scores and conduct scores were higher than 80 points in the previous semester, the grants can be awarded. The period of this scholarship is two academic years, maximum.

### Enrollment Scholarship for Outstanding Students:

Grants (prizes) and certificates of award will be awarded to freshmen whose academic scores achieved the following standards. Criteria and qualifications

- (1) 50% of the tuition and incidental fees for the elite class students of the 5-year Junior College will be granted from the 1st grade to the 7th grade if they enrolled before the 2013 academic year (including the 2013 academic year).

100% of the incidental fee for the elite class students of the 5-year Junior College will be granted from the 1st grade to the 3rd grade and 50% of the tuition and incidental fees from the 4th grade to the 7th grade if they enrolled in the 2014 academic year.

From the 2015 academic year students of the 5-year Junior College (including elite class students) whose scores of the Comprehensive Assessment Program for Junior High School Students achieved A++, grants will be awarded. 100% of the incidental fee for the elite class students of the 5-year Junior College will be granted from the 1st grade to the 3rd grade and 50% of the tuition and incidental fees from the 4th grade to the 7th grade

- (2) Students whose total results of CEEC achieved a 65-grade, applying to study in the 4-year College, 100% of the tuition and incidental fee will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.
- (3) Students who enrolled in the 4-year College/2-year College via Admission of Selection or University Entrance Admission, their scores of 4-year technology institute/2-year junior college program should achieve 600 points (1-time weighted rate for common subject and 2-time weighted rate for specific subject) 100% of the tuition and incidental fee will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.
- (4) NTD10,000 will be granted upon enrollment for students of the 4-year College of Day Div. who have outstanding performance resulting in Admission of Selection.
- (5) 50% of the tuition and incidental fees will be granted for students admitted from the Star Plan during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). It will be granted one time for one semester; the scholarship will be continued in the next semester if students' academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points (including 80 points) in this semester. 100% of the tuition and incidental fee will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.

The score standard is applicable to students who enrolled after the 2012 academic year. Students who enrolled in the period of 2010-2011 academic year, their tuition and incidental fees are not limited in this criterion.

- (6) Students whose average score of each specific subject for admission achieved 90 points or higher, applying to study in the 2-year College, 50% of the tuition

and incidental fees will be granted during the length of study (excluding the period of extension of study). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.

- (7) Graduates from other schools who apply to study in the graduate institute of Wenzao via Admission of Selection or University Entrance Admission, their scores must be the highest of each admission (one postgraduate student for one graduate institute). The scholars whose academic overall scores and conduct scores are higher than 80 points in each semester, grants for the next semester can be awarded.

### Article III. Verifications

If the applicants have the same academic scores, the scholarship will be granted for the one whose conduct scores are higher; if their conduct scores are the same, two of them will become scholarship recipients.

The credits in each semester have to meet the lowest credits required in the Guidelines Governing Course Selection; the Outstanding Performance Scholarship or the Academic Distinction Scholarship can then be granted.

The evaluation of the Outstanding Performance Scholarship and the Academic Distinction Scholarship is made according to these Regulations by following the sequence of scores; lists will be submitted to the President for ratification.

The lists of various scholarships will be compiled by the Office of Academic Affairs after knowing the published records of successful candidates in each admission and ratified by the President. Grants will be awarded accordingly. If scholars are not enrolled, the vacancy will not be filled.

Scholars mentioned in Clause 3 and 4 of Article II will receive only one-grant, if conforming to the two criteria at the same time.

If scholars temporarily suspend schooling or drop out before completing the study within one semester, the grants shall be all returned; specific cases approved by the President are not limited by these Regulations.

Article IV. Scholars are still studying on campus should attend the awarding ceremony and follow the related process; if scholars are not studying on campus or absent from the awarding ceremony without reason, their rights are waived.

Article V. The sums of grants and distributions rely on the planned budgets which are adjustable due to the changing multiple entrance programs per academic year. The budgets will be ratified by the President and announced by the Office of Academic Affairs.

Article VI. These Guidelines become effective after they are approved by the Executive Committee and ratified by the President. Amendments must follow the same procedure.
