

Guidelines for the Implementation of Admission Scholarships for Day Division and In-service Master's Program Students in the 2021 Academic Year

Amended at the Executive Committee Meeting on Nov. 10, 2020
Ratified by the President on Dec. 1, 2020

- I. The Guidelines were according to "Scholarship Regulations for Day Division Students" Article II. 3., formulated to encourage and attract more outstanding students to apply for admission to the University, and to help them reduce their financial burden.
- II. Criteria for granting admission scholarships to students in different day division programs in the 2018 academic year are as follows:
 - (I) 5-year Junior College Program

Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students:

 1. Scholarships will be granted to students who are admitted to the 5-year Junior College Program with a score of 5 A10+ of the Comprehensive Assessment Program for Junior High School Students: all incidental fees for 1st- to 3rd-year students, and all tuition and incidental fees for 4th- and 5th-year students, of the 5-year Junior College Program will be covered during the period of their studies.
 2. Scholarships will be granted to students who are admitted to the 5-year Junior College Program with a score of 5 A7+ of the Comprehensive Assessment Program for Junior High School Students: **half** incidental fees for 1st- to 3rd-year students, and **half** tuition and incidental fees for 4th- and 5th-year students, of the 5-year Junior College Program will be covered during the period of their studies.
 - (II) 4-year College Program
 1. Direct Entry Scholarship:

Half tuition and incidental fees for the following students will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period): outstanding graduating students of the 5-year Junior College Program (within three years of graduation) whose academic performance meets the following criteria, and those who are admitted via a transfer exam to 4-year College Program.

 - (1) A graduating student of the 5-year Junior College Program whose overall academic score (rounded to the nearest integer) puts them within the top 20% of his/her class or department, along with an overall conduct score of higher than 80 and without any major demerit.
 - (2) A graduating student of the 5-year Junior College Program who obtains a score of higher than 280 in the College Student English Proficiency Test (CSEPT) (or an equivalent score in other English proficiency tests), and whose score on a second foreign language proficiency test meets the requirements set by the University for said language.

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive (II)1. scholarship must be at least 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in

the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

2. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students:

- (1) All tuition and incidental fees for students who are admitted to the 4-year College Program via obtaining level 13 or above in both Chinese and English in the General Scholastic Ability Test will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period). The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

NT\$10,000 will be granted upon enrollment to those who obtain level 12 or above in both Chinese and English in the General Scholastic Ability Test.

II 2.(1) scholarship will not be awarded repeatedly. The students who meet the objectives 1 and 2 at the same time, should select one of the scholarships.

- (2) All tuition and incidental fees for students who are admitted to the 4-year College Program via selection or joint registration and placement with a score of higher than 600 on the joint entrance exam for technological and vocational education (onefold weighting of common subjects and twofold weighting of specialized subjects) will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period). The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.
- (3) NT\$10,000 will be granted upon enrollment to each student who is admitted to the 4-year College Program via selection based on his/her special achievement.

(III) 2-year College Program

1. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students

- (1) The total admission score for the 2-year College Program will be used as a calculation criterion. All tuition and incidental fees for students whose admission scores put them in first and second places and who enroll in the University will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period) (without replacement if they waive their rights to enroll in the University).
- (2) The total admission score for the 2-year College Program will be used as a calculation criterion. Half of the tuition and incidental fees for students whose admission scores put them in third and fourth places and who enroll in the University will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period) (without replacement if they waive their rights to enroll in the University).

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive

scholarship must be at least 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

2. A 2-year College Program student in the Day Division who participates in an exchange program during the period of his/her studies can apply for a scholarship in accordance with the Office of International and Cross-strait Cooperation's Guidelines for the Establishment of Exchange Student Scholarships.

(IV) Master's Programs & In-service Master's Program:

For students who are admitted to its Master's Programs via selection and the entrance exam.

Scholarships for Graduates of the University:

All tuition and incidental fees for those who graduated from the 4-year College Program (within three years of graduation) with an overall academic performance of the class is top 3 of 40 or more students, top 2 of 20-39 students, the first place of the class less than 19 students, along with a conduct score of higher than 80 and without any major demerit, will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive scholarship must be at least 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed. He/she can receive the scholarship for up to 2 academic years, and should be arranged as a research assistant (RA).

- III. All scholarships listed in the Guidelines will be granted after being ratified by the President. If a scholarship recipient suspends his/her studies for a reason, he/she will not be replaced by another. Those who continue to receive a scholarship in the next semester shall take the requisite credits that meet the minimum requirements set by the Guidelines for Course Selection; also, they should not withdraw from a course. A scholarship recipient who suspends his/her studies for a reason after being admitted to the University for less than a semester shall return the amount of his/her scholarship to the University in full. However, those who obtain approval from the President are not subject to the rule.
- IV. Depending on changes in the amounts allocated and admissions via multiple channels every academic year, appropriate adjustments may be made to the allocation and amounts of scholarships listed in the Guidelines.
- V. The Guidelines become effective after being approved at the Executive Meeting and ratified by the President. Amendments must follow the same procedure.
