

# Guidelines for the Implementation of Admission Scholarships for Day Division Students in the 2018 Academic Year

Amended at the Executive Committee Meeting on Nov 7, 2017  
Ratified by the President on Nov.23, 2017

- I. The Guidelines were formulated to encourage and attract more outstanding students to apply for admission to the University, and to help them reduce their financial burden.
- II. Criteria for granting admission scholarships to students in different day division programs in the 2018 academic year are as follows:

- (I) 5-year Junior College Program

1. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students:

Scholarships will be granted to students who are admitted to the 5-year Junior College Program with a score of A++ on five subjects of the Comprehensive Assessment Program for Junior High School Students: all incidental fees for 1st- to 3rd-year students, and all tuition and incidental fees for 4th- and 5th-year students, of the 5-year Junior College Program will be covered during the period of their studies.

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

- (II) 4-year College Program

- Direct Entry Scholarship:

All incidental fees for the following students will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period): outstanding graduating students of the 5-year Junior College Program (including those who delay their graduation and in elite classes) whose academic performance meets the following criteria, and those who are admitted via a transfer exam in the summer to the Department of Applied Chinese, the Department of Foreign Language Instruction, the Department of Translation and Interpreting, the Department of International Affairs, the Department of International Business Administration, the Department of Digital Content Application and Management, and the Department of Communication Arts.

- (1) A graduating student of the 5-year Junior College Program whose overall academic score (rounded to the nearest integer) puts them within the top 20% of his/her class or department, along with an overall conduct score of higher than 80 and without any major demerit.
- (2) A graduating student of the 5-year Junior College Program who obtains a score of higher than 280 in the College Student English Proficiency Test (CSEPT) (or an equivalent score in other English proficiency tests), and whose score on a second foreign language proficiency test meets the requirements set by the University for said language.

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be at least 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

2. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students:

- (1) All tuition and incidental fees for students who are admitted to the 4-year College Program with a college entrance exam score of 60 will be covered during the

period of their studies (excluding the extension period). The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

- (2) All tuition and incidental fees for students who are admitted to the 4-year College Program via selection or joint registration and placement with a score of higher than 600 on the joint entrance exam for technological and vocational education (onfold weighting of common subjects and twofold weighting of specialized subjects) will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period). The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.
- (3) NT\$10,000 will be granted upon enrollment to each student who is admitted to the 4-year College Program via selection based on his/her special achievement.
- (4) Half of the tuition and incidental fees for students who are admitted to the University via the Multi-star Project will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period). The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

### (III) 2-year College Program

#### 1. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students

- (1) All tuition and incidental fees for students whose admission scores put them in first and second places in their respective departments will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).
- (2) Half of the tuition and incidental fees for students whose admission scores put them in third and fourth places in their respective departments will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive the aforementioned types of scholarships must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarships in the next semester; otherwise, their scholarships will be temporarily suspended. Once they achieve the prescribed scores in the following semester, their scholarships will be resumed.

#### 2. Admission Scholarships for Elite Class Students

Half of the tuition and incidental fees for those who were admitted to the Dual-language, Interdisciplinary & International Professionals Program (the Elite 5-year Junior College Program) in the 2013 academic year will be covered during the period of their studies (from year 1 to year 7).

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

3. A 2-year College Program student in the Day Division who participates in an exchange program during the period of his/her studies can apply for a scholarship in

accordance with the Office of International and Cross-strait Cooperation's Guidelines for the Establishment of Exchange Student Scholarships.

(IV) Master's Programs:

1. Scholarships for Graduates of the University:

- (1) All tuition and incidental fees for those who graduated from the 4-year College Program or the 5-year Junior College Program with an overall academic score that puts them within the top 10% of their respective classes, along with a conduct score of higher than 80 and without any major demerit, will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).
- (2) Half of the tuition and incidental fees for those who graduated from the 4-year College Program or the 5-year Junior College Program with an overall academic score that puts them within the top 50% of their respective classes, along with a conduct score of higher than 80 and without any major demerit, will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).
- (3) NT\$10,000 will be granted upon enrollment to those who fail to achieve the prescribed criteria.

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be at least 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed. He/she can receive the scholarship for up to 2 academic years.

2. Admission Scholarships for Outstanding Students:

- (1) Half of the tuition and incidental fees for those who are not graduates of the University, but are admitted to its Master's Programs via selection and the entrance exam, respectively, with the highest score will be covered during the period of their studies (excluding the extension period).
- (2) NT\$10,000 will be granted upon enrollment to those who fail to achieve the prescribed criteria.

The overall academic and conduct scores of those who receive such a scholarship must be higher than 80, in order to continue to receive the scholarship in the next semester; otherwise, his/her scholarship will be temporarily suspended. Once he/she achieves the prescribed scores in the following semester, his/her scholarship will be resumed.

- III. All scholarships listed in the Guidelines will be granted after being ratified by the President. If a scholarship recipient suspends his/her studies for a reason, he/she will not be replaced by another. Those who continue to receive a scholarship in the next semester shall take the requisite credits that meet the minimum requirements set by the Guidelines for Course Selection; also, they should not withdraw from a course. A scholarship recipient who suspends his/her studies for a reason after being admitted to the University for less than a semester shall return the amount of his/her scholarship to the University in full. However, those who obtain approval from the President are not subject to the rule.
- IV. Depending on changes in the amounts allocated and admissions via multiple channels every academic year, appropriate adjustments may be made to the allocation and amounts of scholarships listed in the Guidelines.
- V. The Guidelines become effective after being approved at the Executive Meeting and ratified by the President. Amendments must follow the same procedure.
